## PROJECT SUCCESS RATES AGILE VS WATERFALL

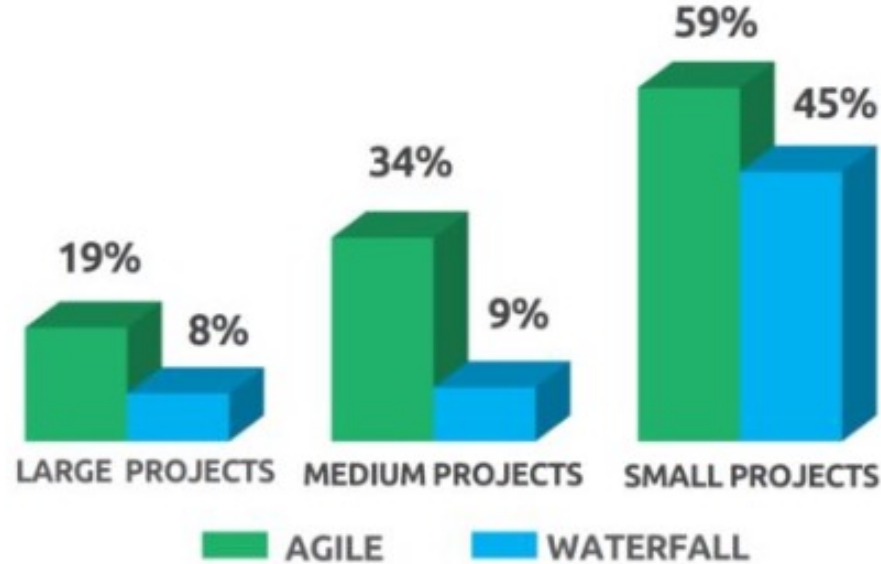

“We are uncovering better ways of developing software by doing it and helping others do it. Through this work we have come to value:

**Individuals and Interactions** *over* processes and tools

**Working software** *over* comprehensive documentation

**Customer collaboration** *over* contract negotiation

**Responding to change** *over* following a plan

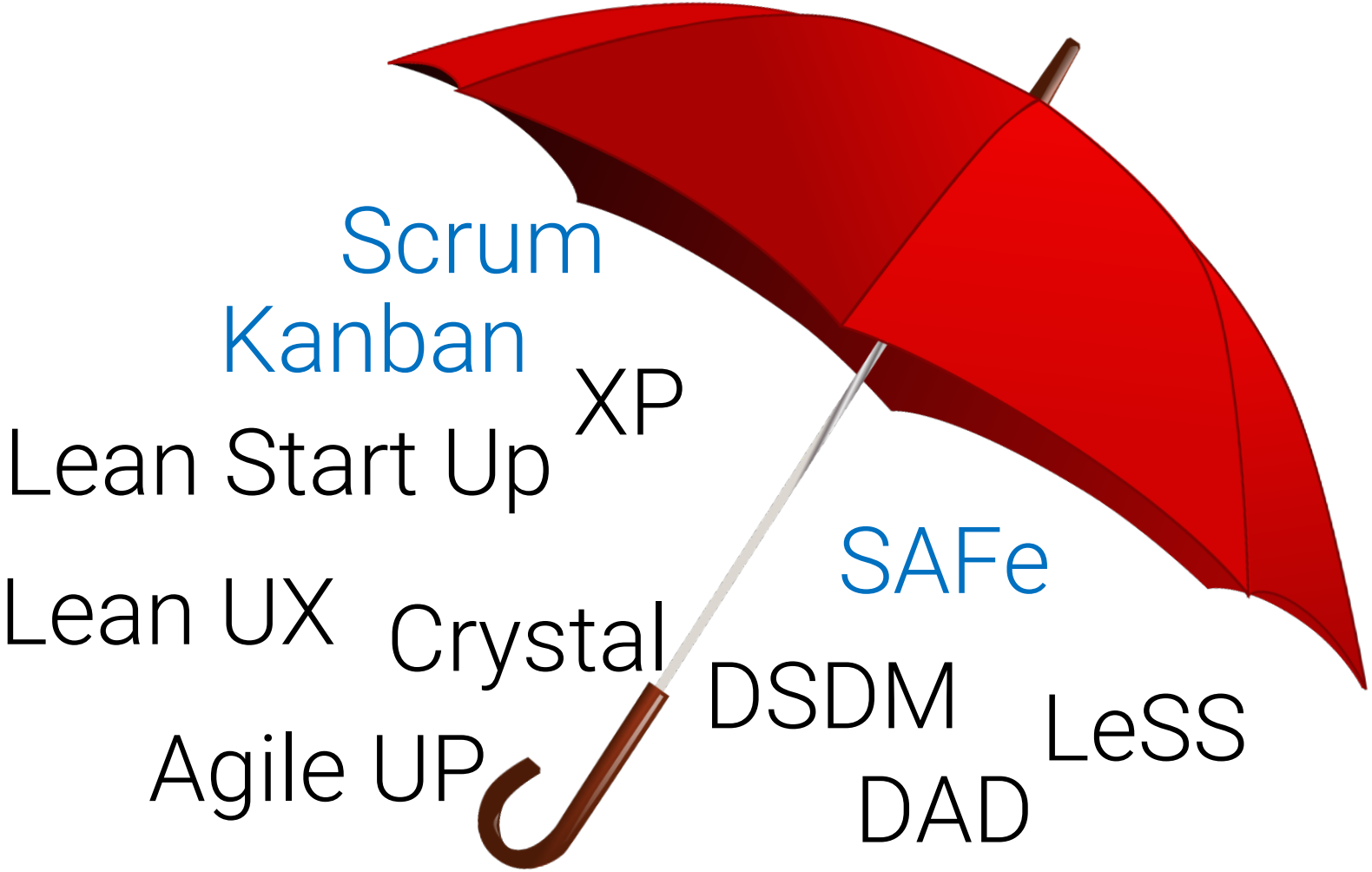

## 12 Agile Principles

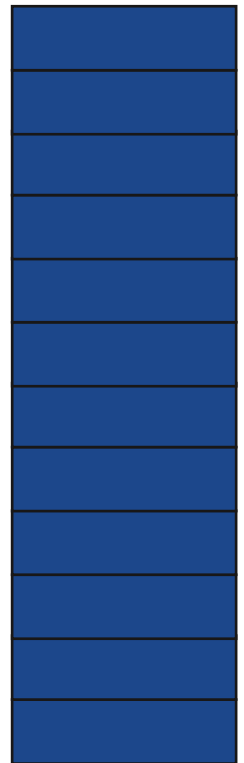
- Accommodate changing requirements throughout the development process
- Deliver working versions frequently
- Bring business people and “techies” together
- Motivate, trust, and support your team
- Engage in face-to-face conversation
- Measure progress with working versions of the final product
- Encourage sustainable development
- Maintain a constant pace of development
- Pay attention to technical excellence and good design
- Simplify the work as much as possible
- Self-organize and reflect on how to improve

# Agile Umbrella

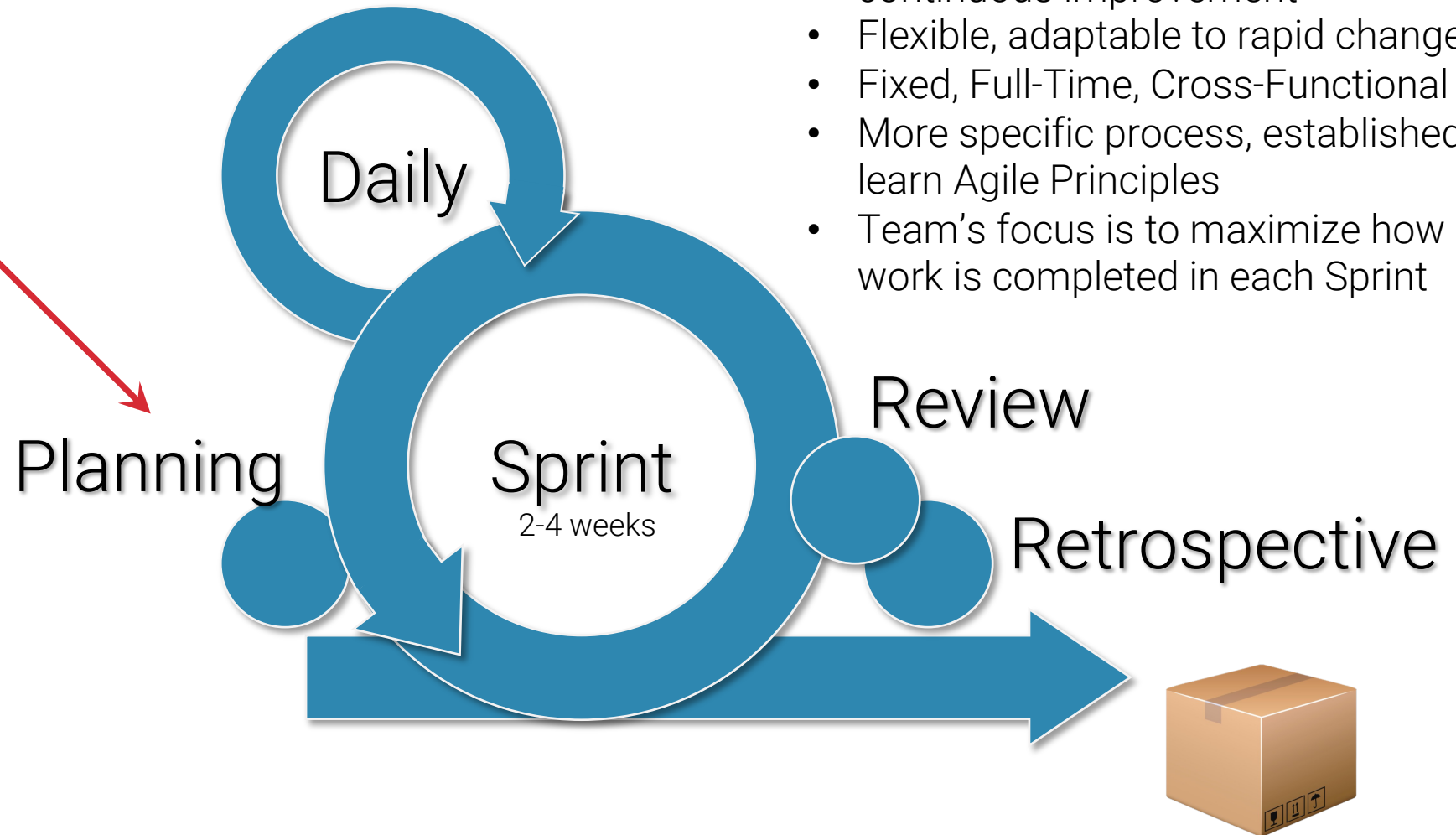




# Scrum

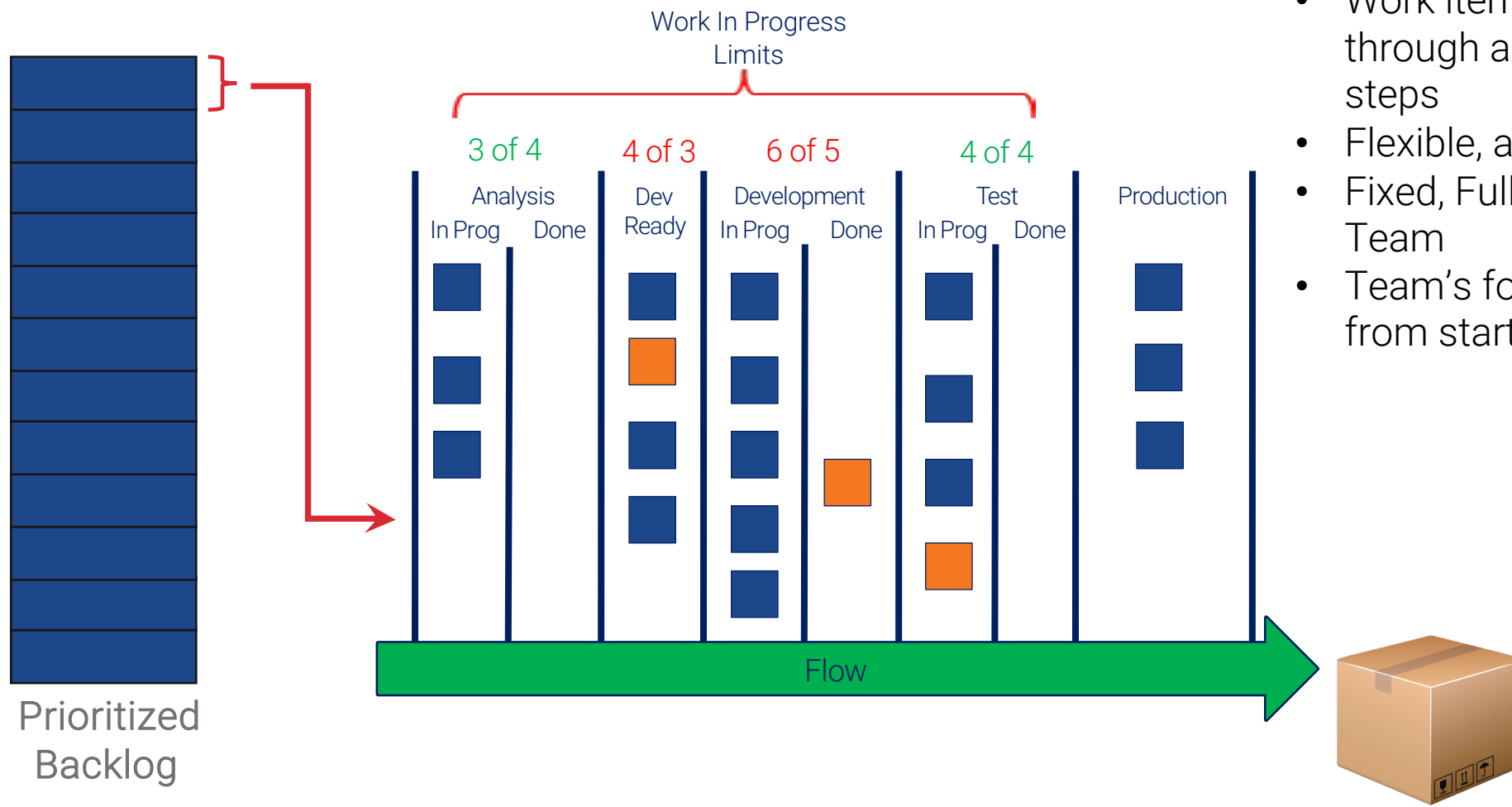


Prioritized Backlog



- Work organized into shorter Sprints and continuous improvement
- Flexible, adaptable to rapid changes
- Fixed, Full-Time, Cross-Functional Team
- More specific process, established way to learn Agile Principles
- Team's focus is to maximize how much work is completed in each Sprint

# Kanban



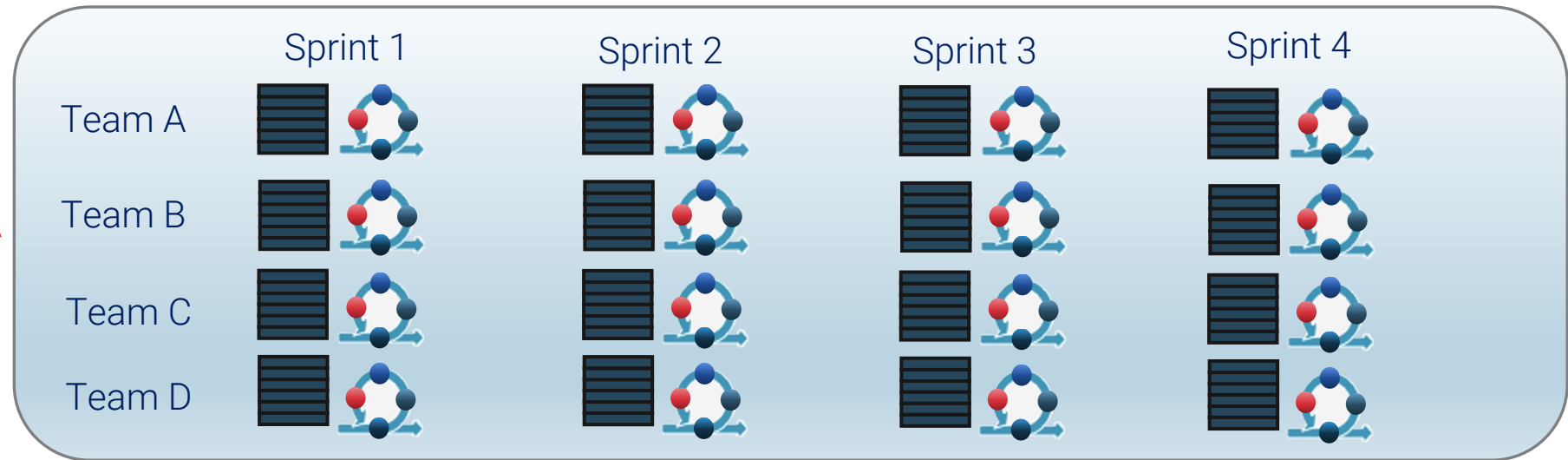
- Work items flow continuously through a well-defined sequence of steps
- Flexible, adaptable to rapid changes
- Fixed, Full-Time, Cross-Functional Team
- Team's focus is to reduce the time from start to finish of each work item

# Scaled Agile

- The foundation of Scaled Agile is Agile Teams
- Provides tools for planning and coordinating larger work efforts across multiple Scrum teams
- The group of teams agree to a timeframe for completing the coordinated work

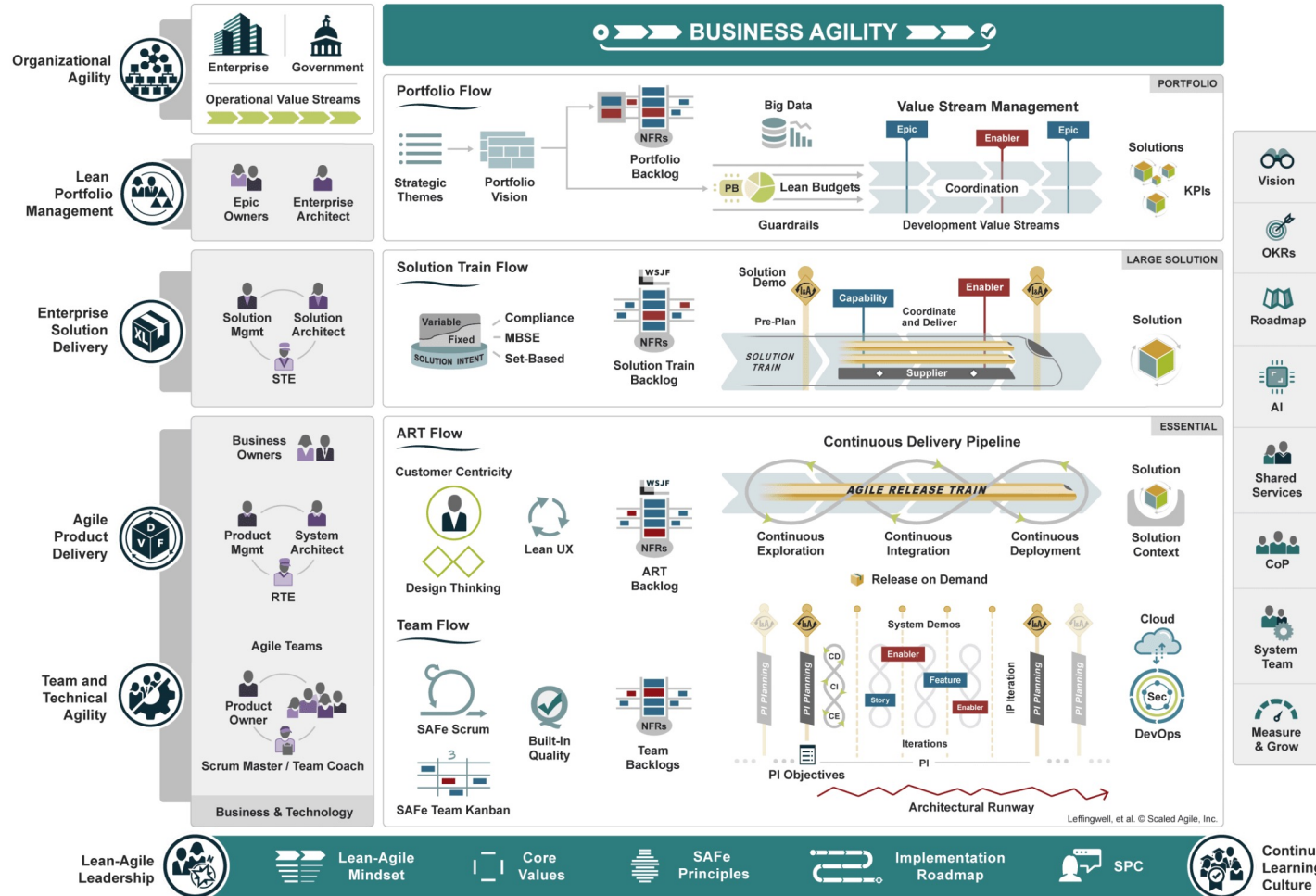

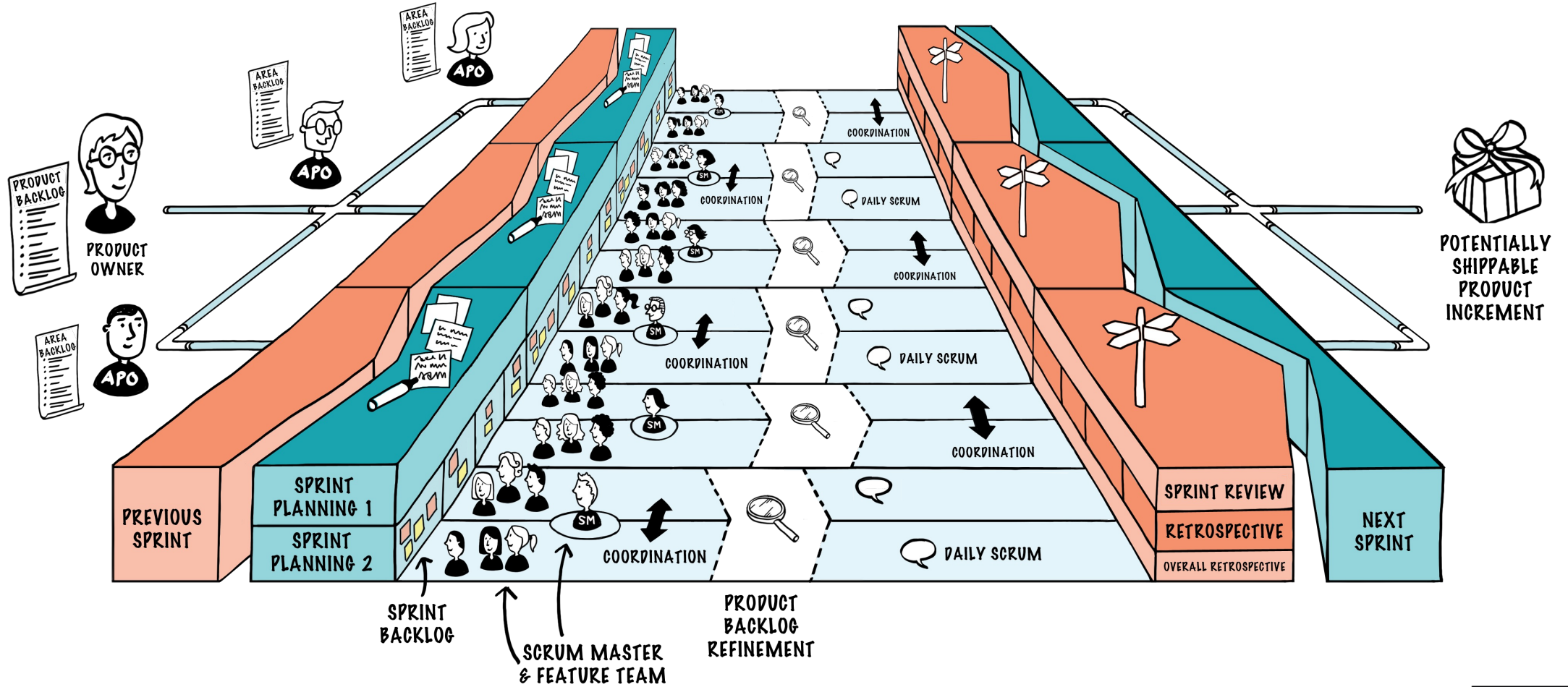

# Characteristics of Agile

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- Team Agile
  - This is where Scrum and Kanban methodologies are leveraged
  - Teams work in an agile mindset and flow individually
    - Shared accountability
    - Empowered to understand and identify value of work
    - Manages readiness of work and velocity
- Portfolio Agile
  - Funding capacity instead of Projects
  - Work is brought to the Teams vs staff assigned to Projects
  - Work is defined as a hypothesis to deliver value instead of fixed scope projects

# Impact of Agile on TBM Models

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- Agile can enable changes or even elimination of timekeeping
  - Has anyone experienced the elimination of timekeeping due to agile?
- Agile can include a shift of funding from projects to capacity
