# Stock Objects – Not Always a fit



### The OOTB content is great...until...

- You have different terms
- You have unique use cases
- You have different processes
- You have multiple groups with different requirements

The evolution of the product lends itself to configurable options that don't require team members to re-learn processes and terms!

# Project vs. Custom Investment Type (aka CIT)



- Delivered out of the box (don't need to add fields for standard stuff)
- Supports timelines, Gantt charts, grid
- Supports tentative plans and auto-scheduling





- Need to be created, custom. Some traditional fields and modules come over (from the investment object) buy you may need to create fields, sub-objects, etc
- Supports timelines, Gantt charts, grid
- Supports tentative plans and auto-scheduling
- Ex: Other Work (PTO, Admin), different group w/in same organization, non-traditional projects (Executive Recruiting, Decision Support, Strategy)

\*No baselines, copy from templates, MSP exports or subprojects

# Idea vs. a Custom Investment Type



dea

- Capture business case information
- Capture timelines, financials, staff requirements
- Can convert, after approval, to an investment (and even move data forward)
- Require a viewer license to update



- Capture business case information
- Capture timelines, financials, staff requirements
- Custom process to convert to another investment type
- Require a full license to update (similar to project)

# Objectives vs. Custom Investment Type



Objectives

- OOTB with no creation necessary
- Includes the Investment tab to associate Investments to Objectives
- Allow grid nesting to view Objectives and Key Results in a single view
- Requires a different Hierarchy type that cannot be combined with Investments
- Clarity's product roadmap shows significant enhancements in future releases



N

- Require manual build one or more CIT
- Will include all fields from the investment object
- May require custom processes to achieve roll-ups
- May be combined with Investments in a Hierarchy

## Roadmaps vs. Hierarchies



Roadmap

Hierarchy

Roll up chosen work

- Provide many visual insights
- And updates are **NOT** pushed back to investments
- Allow for what if scenarios
- Allows for modeling against constraints and targets
- Only shows "current state" after job has been run
- Ex: 5 Year Strategic, Product Roadmap, Annual Operating Planning, Prioritization

GREAT for planning and showing "where we are going"



- Roll up chosen work
- Provide many visual insights
- Show real-time, current state without a job
- Any updates pushed back to Investments
- Cannot do comparisons or versions of the hierarchy
- Can roll up into dashboards and canvases current information
- Ex: Portfolios, Programs, Department level, multi-project grouping

GREAT for portfolio and program roll ups to communicate progress

### Agreements vs. Project/Roadmap Dependencies

Project/Roadmap

- Properties usually managed via Canvas
- Can be utilized across Roadmaps and Investments
- Includes standard fields out of the box
- Investment to Investment only
- Capture additional information like Narrative, Get Well Plan and any other custom fields

- PRJ Can be done at the task level across projects
- PRJ Visualize dependent tasks in Investment Gantt
- PRJ Utilize the Agreements module to visual
- RDMP Exist only in that specific roadmap
- RDMP Investment to Investment only
- RDMP Need to be manually created
